MoDOT to open reversible lanes for Tuesday evening rush

ST. LOUIS – The Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) and its contractor Fred Weber, Inc., will reopen the Interstate 70 reversible lanes at 3 p.m. Tuesday, May 4, in time for evening rush hour traffic.

Based on traffic patterns, the lanes will remain eastbound for both morning and evening rush periods.

The lanes were closed so crews could work on the Madison Street bridge. That work is being done in conjunction with constructing the new Mississippi River Bridge to relocate I-70 across the Mississippi River.

“As we work on the new Mississippi River Bridge project, we will make every effort to keep the reversible lanes open as much as we can,” said Greg Horn, New Mississippi River Bridge project director.

Once crews complete the construction of the Madison Street Bridge later this summer, the reversible lanes will close again for another two months to remove and replace the St. Louis Avenue bridge.
